I respectfully make application to be transferred from
the A.I.F. to Shipbuilding.

My reasons are as follows - I am 49 years of age, and
have had 3 years service with the A.I.F. serving in Egypt also
in France. My present classification is C.1.

Although I am a married man with a Wife and five children
(residing at Brighton E) to support, I receive no assistance
from the Australian Government to aid me in supporting them.

In March of this year an application was made by me
(at the O.T.B. where I was stationed) to transfer to the
shipbuilding trade; but owing to an error I was forwarded on to
the A.F.C. Depot - where I am not employed at my trade.

If my request is granted it will enable me to render more
valuable service than I am at present doing, at the same time
allowing me an opportunity of maintaining my wife and
children in a decent manner.
