4. 3.18. Reported to Officer-in-Charge, Australian Munitions Workers, London. *Plymouth*
8. 3.18. Began work with Messrs. Trollope & Colls, Aintree, as Labourer.
 undated. Statement of a/c of voyage allow. Amount still owing by C. £6.4.6.
 " Letter to OI/C from C. Notifying transfer to Messrs. Boot & Son, Calshot, Southampton. (Ack. 4.7.18)
21. 8.18. Letter to OI/C from C, requesting transfer to Midlands to be near aged Mother whom he helps to support. Has enquired at West Bromwich E.E. and was told could get plenty of Government work there, if free from present job. (Ack. 26. 8.18. Referring him to local E.E. who, he feels sure, will favourably consider circumstances of case.)
- 11.11.18. Letter to OI/C from C, re matter of transfer, E.E. has failed to find work, and if he is free, can find it for himself, would be glad of advice. (Ack. 15.11.18. Advises him to remain where he is as it is increasingly difficult to find work for A.W.W.s)
16. 2.19. Letter to OI/C from C. States he has just heard that his wife is sailing for England on s.s. "Orontes". Would like to call for interview re termination of agreement. (Ack. 20. 2.19. Asking when wife leaves and when expected. There is an outstanding amount due on allotment, which should be adjusted and details sent. Application will then be favourably considered. Amount owing £4.3.1.)
2. 3.19. Letter to OI/C from C. Cannot say exact date of wife's sailing. Thinks amount of allot arrears must be overstated.
8. 3.19. Letter from OI/C to C. Re amount of allot owing and enclosing statement of account showing balance now outstanding £4.13.1. less any money held at present by employer. Allot. should be continued till information to hand re wife's sailing. (Ack. 16. 3.19. States has another £2.15.0, to add to allot. arrears. Will forward balance. Has received cable from wife saying sailing on 5. 3.19.)
19. 3.19. Cable from OI/C to Defence, re sailing of Mrs. C, and stating C desires mutual determination of agreement in this country.
22. 3.19. Letter to OI/C from C, enclosing £1.18.1. to settle up allotment arrears. (Ack. 26. 3.19. Has cabled Defence re determination of agreement. Will communicate reply when received.)
22. 4.19. Cable to OI/c from Defence. Termination of agreement with C. approved 18.3.19.
25. 4.19. Letter to OI/c from C. Enquiring re cancellation of agreement. Expects wife to land in England shortly. Enquires re allotment arrears. (Ack. 26.4.19. Determination of agreement approved. Allot. arrears £1.5.8.)
4. 5.19. Letter to OI/c from C. Enclosing 10/- which he thinks clears allot. account to 18.4.19, on which date wife left Sydney. Wife states 16/8. was deducted from her last pay.
10. 5.19. Letter from OI/c to C. Enclosing forms to be signed (officially witnessed) and returned with badge and exemption certificate. Will not be paid accumulated special allowance of 2/- per day & return to Australia at later date., must be at his own expense. (Ack. 13.5.19 Returns forms duly signed and witnessed, also badge and certificate.)
14. 5.19. Letter from OI/c to C. Certifying determination of agreement on 18.3.19 to be signed and returned. Still owes 10/8. (Ack. 16.5.19. Letter returned signed. Thinks statement that he owes 10/8 for allotment incorrect. Paid Messrs. Trollope & Colls, £3.15.0. Messrs Boot & Son, £9.5.0.. Australia House £1.18.1. clearing allotment to 3.3.19. Further 10/- paid clearing allot to 18.3.18 on which date wife left Sydney. Can provide receipts. 16/6 deducted at Victoria Barracks from last fortnight pay to wife.
